My wife (Gay) and I moved to 30A from Lake Lanier in Atlanta to live here full time in 2016. We have owned a home on 30A for nearly 25 years. We were married in DeFuniak Springs (where my wife grew up) 37 years ago. My father-in-law was one of the original members of this club when it was first established. I am currently serving as a Board member, Treasurer and Interim CEO of Children's Volunteer Health Network. We are invested in this community and we have always thought the club was a "gem". Initially it wasn't practical to join the club living out of the area (LA, New York, Atlanta) but we did join prior to moving here full time because the ClubCorp relationship allowed us to keep our membership at the Buckhead Club in Atlanta.

I have served the Board over the past year as a member of the Finance Committee. I was asked to assist with the capital improvement planning and the assessment of ClubCorp's performance. As a result, we now have an ongoing capital planning tool that allows the Board to project the needs for major capital projects, and as importantly, to project the means to fund those projects. This allows us to foresee the needed major projects and faithfully address our financial obligations as stewards of the membership's interests. My recent service to the Finance Committee has proven me to be resourceful, focused and practical. Here are a couple of my specific observations about SRGBC and how I might assist as a Director.

I have played courses all over the US, and our course is in great condition. Mike, Kelly, and Carter have all put a professional focus on the course and it is a pleasure to play. This focus and anticipation of course needs must be maintained in order to assure future years of great play. I have learned a critical lesson working with the hospitality industry -- if you defer maintenance you greatly diminish your members' enjoyment, you will lose member interest and it will cost more to put it back to where it should be than if you had maintained it properly to begin with. That will be my focus.

Despite the excellent course condition, the golf experience at SRGBC is sub-par as the golf clubhouse physical condition is disappointingly inferior to this club's unique potential. I have been fortunate to have attended and been a member at several clubs and I most enjoy the experience when the clubhouse quality and style are representative of the character and quality of the course and its membership -- our clubhouse does not currently reflect either. I believe this is an immediate concern. We have sound financial footing, economic and membership prospects are high and we must assure our club reflects our standards. I will work towards a reasonable clubhouse renovation that creates an inviting and comfortable setting for our members.

The beach club is a tremendous asset. As the 30A area becomes more populated and the beach access more restricted, the beach club may become as valuable a benefit to our members as the golf course (even to the most ardent golfer). In my view, it is reckless to use even one square foot of space of the beachside structure for administrative offices. By making a jewel for our members' direct enjoyment of this resort quality beach setting we make our club more satisfying to current members and more enticing for potential members. I will work to improve our facilities for maximum enjoyment of the beach facilities and to relocate our administrative functions to a more appropriate and efficient space.
